



Wilmington celebrates the legacy of artist and activist **Dorothy Gillespie** in collaboration with The Dorothy M. Gillespie Foundation. Gillespie had close ties in Wilmington through a long-time friendship with Tony Rivenbark, Executive Director of Thalian Hall Center for the Performing Arts, who worked as her studio assistant in the 1970s. Rivenbark brought Gillespie and her art to the Cape Fear Region, where her legacy continues through the public display of her works across multiple venues. Today, Wilmington presents the most public art by Dorothy Gillespie in the U.S.

Dorothy Gillespie’s (1920-2012) career spanned seven decades, always in the forefront of the American Art movement. A renowned painter, sculptor, and installation artist, Dorothy Gillespie’s work encompassed many significant 20th-century trends in art, including abstract expressionism, decorative abstraction, site-specific installations, the women’s movement, and art in public spaces. She pioneered new directions for metal sculpture and is best known for her large-scale, colorfully painted arrangements of cut aluminum strips that radiate, undulate, or curl in giant arrangements of ribbon, enchanted towers, or bursting fireworks.





